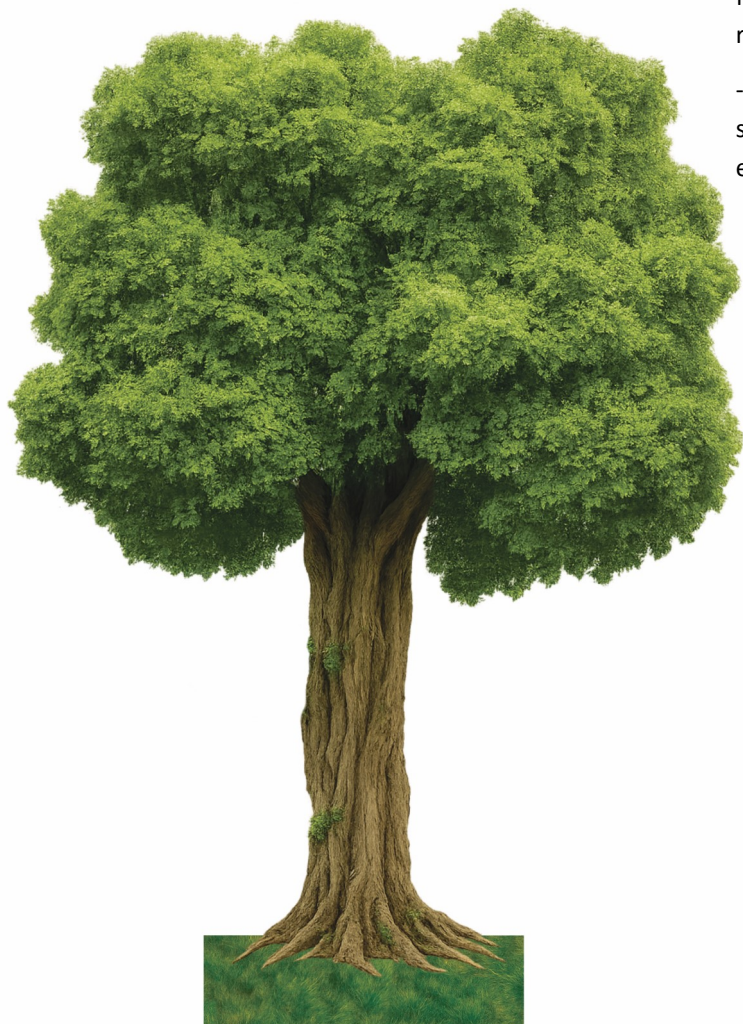
Accessories: FRONT PAGE

- **Use thick paper** (300g/m² to 400g/m² recommended).

- **Print this page on one side and the next page on the other side.** most commercial printers will jam if printed directly double sided. To avoid this, it is recommended to print the front page first, then to put the sheet pack in the printer and print the other side.

- **Cut following the front images.** No need to be very precise and follow each leaves. Just do it roughly, it will work well.

- **Optionnal: you can plastify** the sheets by sticking clear tape on each side before cutting.





Accessories: BACK PAGE

These drawings are larger to accomodate for the precision of the printer.

Cut following the front, the back should follow well.
